Friends,

Do you remember the census? Sure you do! You answered questions, gave information, and consented to be counted among the 308,745,538 Americans whose genders, ethnic backgrounds, in-

comes, etc. were documented and registered by the federal government. While that might not seem like that long ago, we are actually closer to the next census than we are to the last one!

That is remarkable, because the last census was the first one to be completely computerized, processed, and available within mere months of its completion. Even the 2000 census took a while to process, thanks to those old dial-up internet connections. With the way that technology progresses these days, who knows how fast we might be able to process the next census—it could even be done by July of 2019!

In this age of readily available information, we are able to gather and process data in ways that people could not even have conceived only a few generations ago. We know how to measure, perceive patterns, and even predict many things at which our ancestors could only make educated guesses (or at least less accurate educated guesses). In doing so, we have seemingly become the masters of one of the most mysterious phenomena in the history of humankind: numbers.

It might sound strange that numbers are at the root of great human wonderment and mystery, but numbers often represented mystery and power in ancient cultures. We even find some of this in the Bible, often with numbers like 7, 12, 40, 70, and 144,000. Elsewhere in the Bible—particularly in the Old Testament—we find many examples of things being counted and cited, and even some examples of census-taking.

For the months of September and October, we will be studying the events surrounding some of those examples, which appear in the book of—you guessed it—Numbers. In Numbers, the Israelites were still making their way from Egypt to the Promised Land, but they had a few hiccups on the way. God wanted them to get ready and go, but they became hesitant and fearful. God wasn't thrilled about this, so He had them wait longer and gave them additional rules and instructions. Eventually, after many years, they were prepared to follow God when He led them to the cusp of the Promised Land.

There are some classic Bible stories in Numbers, such as the census of the Israelites, God providing quail for them to eat, and the saga of Caleb and Joshua. As with so many Old Testament stories, these can help us understand our relationship with God and where He is leading us. While we will focus on those stories in September and October, we will also look at how God ultimately answers those same concerns and anxieties in Christ Jesus, and what kind of assurance we can take from him.

Many of those assurances, of course, are articulated in the various letters written by New Testament figures to their Christian brothers and sisters. Thus, our series for September and October will be "Numbers and Letters." I look forward to delving deeply with you into God's grace and his desires for us this fall...

...and I also look forward to Wednesday Night Suppers, Men's Breakfasts, the beginning of the Day School year, and all of the wonderful ways God has called us to serve Him together! Happy September!


