Friends,

When it comes to raising money in the church, there are legions of resources and tips that have been passed down from pastor to pastor over the years. One strategy, which I have not put into practice with you until this year, is the scheduling of Commitment Sunday on the same day that we “fall back” from Daylight Savings Time to Standard Time. The theory is that the extra hour of sleep will result in increased attendance and better moods, inspiring the congregation to pledge beyond its wildest dreams.

I am not sure if I believe that. I think most folks already have a pretty good idea of what they’re going to pledge by the time they get to worship on Commitment Sunday, and if not, then they can always mail their pledge card to the church or drop it in the offering plate another Sunday. If there are any advantages to our having Commitment Sunday a week earlier this year, then they are that our service will be on the radio and that there is an extra week afterward to receive pledges and tweak the 2017 budget. The extra sleep is just a bonus.

As the Stewardship Committee has already indicated (see their letter inside this newsletter), you have been remarkably consistent in your giving this year, and you have given the Finance Committee and Session the confidence to increase our missions budget and be optimistic about the coming year. I know that we will come through once again with our pledges, and that those who choose not to pledge will still be faithful in giving. Therefore, Commitment Sunday should be an opportunity to enjoy an hour of sleep, come to Sunday school and worship well rested, and worship God together.

It will also be a chance to enjoy another Bible passage from 1 Peter, which is always a good place to go for encouragement in the midst of a tumultuous and uncertain world. Peter reminds us that God has called us together and given us gifts so that we may be focused on working for Jesus’s sake even when things are hard. This is part of what it means to be “Stewards of God’s Grace.”

So, I look forward to seeing you on Commitment Sunday and to finishing our short series on 1 Peter the following week. After that, we will be heading toward the Thanksgiving holiday and then the first Sunday of Advent, which is technically the start of the new worship year. It may be hard to believe that 2016 is already done, but the church calendar has less than a month left in it!

As far as the rest of November is concerned, we have two great Wednesday Night Supper presentations lined up, with Dr. Ralph Hawkins presenting on archaeology on November 2 and Dr. Jay Hayes speaking about the Protestant Reformation on November 16. Also, please take note that the Community Thanksgiving Service is on Monday, November 21, at St. Luke’s United Methodist Church.

Thank you for your generosity—past, present, and future—and I look forward to seeing you at all these wonderful events in November!

Friends,

This past Wednesday, the Finance Committee made its annual report of the church's financial status and prospective budget for the upcoming year. Even though the presentation was similar to previous years' presentations—i.e., a general overview of church finances—you might have noticed one major difference: We are on pace with the budget!

There are a number of factors for this, but the primary one is your consistent generosity. While it has helped to have a reduced and balanced budget this year, the most remarkable factor in our current financial status is the consistency that you have shown in your giving. It is common—even expected—for churches to fluctuate in income throughout the year and to lag behind the budget until the very last minute. In 2016, however, you have been steady with your contributions, allowing the Finance Committee and Session to have confidence in setting the budget for 2017.

That budget will include an increase in missions giving and some adjustments where our committees have found ways to cut costs. Aside from the simple details of the budget, however, your consistency and generosity have shown optimism in another area: God's continued work through the life and ministry of First Presbyterian Church! The ability to plan and be confident in budgeting is a significant way that a church can express its health and its faith in God's provision.

Needless to say, we would still love to close 2016 with a flourish. Beyond December, we would also like for our 2016 experience to become the rule rather than the exception. For this reason, we ask you to make financial pledges so that we may better forecast our capacity to supply and serve in the various ways that God has called us.

Our stewardship verse for this year, 1 Peter 4:10, addresses that desire: **"Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."**

As "Stewards of God's Grace," we acknowledge that God is the giver of gifts both great and small. Whether we are contributing time, talents, or treasure, we know that God has provided us with them so that we ourselves may be put to His use. Confident in this truth, we are no longer constrained by scarcity, but are able to adopt a perspective of abundance: seeing new opportunities to reach out and join the Holy Spirit in Christ's work around us.

On November 6, we will begin submitting our financial pledges for the coming year. You may place your pledge card in the offering plate or mail it to the church office at your convenience. Thank you again for your wonderful generosity in 2016, and please prayerfully consider the ways that God is calling you to steward His gifts through our church.
