If a baby is born on Christmas Day, what do the parents do about all the "Baby's First Christmas" paraphernalia? Do they accumulate it beforehand, and then store it for a year if the baby arrives later? Do they wait until the next year, because that's the first full, 24-hour Christmas, or the first full Christmas season? I guess these are questions that Mary and Joseph didn't have to think about on their way to Bethlehem. Whenever Jesus decided to arrive, it would be everyone's first Christmas, with John the Baptist already wearing the first commemorative onesie.

Here at FPC, we are preparing for our 190th Christmas (our founding was on December 31, 1826, so we just missed that Christmas). That's a lot of poinsettias and candles, but it is good to know that the center of it all—God taking on life and uniting Himself with us in Christ Jesus—is still the same. Each year we spend the season of Advent rehearsing the stories of preparation and expectation that accompanied Jesus's birth, and we also take note of them in preparation for his return. The season serves as a recalibration so that we can acknowledge the ways that God arrives in our lives and calls us to respond.

While we remain grounded in the truth of the story, God may show up in different ways and call us to different responses over time. There are a lot of things that we have and that we do now that our ancestors would not have recognized on Christmas Day, 1827. Of course, if we tried to do everything the same way we did it in 1827, then we would not be responding to the Gospel in ways that people in today's world would recognize, either.

So, while we hold fast to the truth of the incarnation and to God's purposes in Christ Jesus, we also know that God has put us here, now, and with the days to come so that we may reach people here, now, and in those days to come. That is one of the biggest challenges of being prepared for Jesus to show up in our lives: we don't know exactly how he is going to work until he does. As the Gospels show us, those who were prepared for God to work in a new way were the ones who recognized Jesus, and those whose concept of God was confined to the old ways were the ones who missed him.

As we celebrate all of the wonderful traditions of Christmas, both in the church and among our families and friends, we need to be aware of the new opportunities God gives us to serve and follow Him. Whether it is a first Christmas or a 190th, the Holy Spirit is still active, showing us new things and calling us back to the truth. Let us hope for the work to come and hold fast to the joy we have in Christ.


