As we look ahead at the month of April, I would like to reflect on the wonderful way that we ended the month of March. In a nine-day span—March 19 to 27—we held seven worship services in the sanctuary and chapel and served seven lunches in the fellowship hall. One of those services was our largest of the year, and two of those lunches were on the busiest Saturdays of each month.

Among all of those events, the attendance of people who are not members of First Presbyterian Church was probably somewhere in the 350-400 range. That is a large number of guests and visitors, and I hope that you were able to meet at least a few of them. That week of the year is certainly a time when we answer the call to hospitality.

With that said, I would like for us all to consider the ways that we communicate hospitality to others, whether in the church building, in our homes, or even walking down the street. In fact, I want us to think and pray about the ways that we can be hospitable no matter who and where we are. After all, if this world is only our temporary home and we are truly citizens of the Kingdom of God, then shouldn't we be good hosts to those whom God is trying to bring into His Kingdom?

That might sound a bit metaphysical, but it would have rung a bell with our ancestors in the faith. In fact, terms like "Heavenly Host" and "Lord of Hosts" are ancient, and were used by a number of different religions before God revealed Himself to be *the* one true God. Heaven itself has often been portrayed as a banquet, and our own celebration of the Lord's Supper reflects that.

Jesus brought that feast to us and showed that fellowship with God is something that can exist in our own regular lives. So, while hospitality may be a Spiritual gift at which some of us particularly excel, it is also a calling that we have as we endeavor to follow Christ. As such, we will spend much of the month of April studying holy hospitality.



Our primary text for the month will be Luke 10, the first part of which was the focus of an entire sermon series a few years ago. In this one chapter, we have a story of the disciples being hosted by people, a story of unexpected highway hospitality, and a story about a high anxiety host.

So what does it mean to be hospitable? Well, as we will read and study, hospitality is not merely about our effort to get more people to church. Rather, it is our responsibility for doing the things that God has called and enabled us to do with and for others. God calls us to be gracious co-hosts on his behalf, sharing all of the wonderful gifts He has given with the world.

I look forward to enjoying God's hospitality both with you and through you this month!

A Special Report: Joyce Perez, Richard Bagby and Olivia Walthall's trip to Columbia


Open Arms is a ministry to children in Columbia. When they began, there were many children who were abandoned by their parents to live on the street. Open Arms established a center downtown where children could come off of the streets for the day, wash their clothes, enjoy meals and classes. Eventually, some were moved to a farm in San Pedro, where they could grow up in a stable environment and attend school. At its peak, there were 45 boys living at the farm. Today, many of these boys are grown up, pursuing higher education, working in many different professions, and beginning families of their own.

For many years, Open Arms received support from the Colombian government as well as churches from around the world. Over time, the government attempted to exert pressure on the foundation to eliminate Christian teaching and spiritual formation from Open Arm's ministry to the boys. Bill Perrow, the organization's founder and director, knew that it was time to begin again – this time without government sponsorship. The farm closed for a couple of years while Open Arms worked to disentangle itself from the government.

Today, Open Arms is beginning again. They are preparing to raise up a second harvest of children that will grow into productive, Christian adult men. Demographics in Medellin have changed over the years. While abandoned or neglected children remain a pressing issue for the city, the area surrounding the downtown center has been revitalized and is increasingly upscale.

The six boys at the farm today were referred by individuals associated with the two

Richard, Olivia, and Joyce joined eight young women from The World Race (11 countries in 11 months). We spent time painting, cleaning, and making repairs to get the farm ready to pass a sanitation inspection. During the two years that the farm was closed many things fell into disrepair. Richard, who is handy with tools and a very clever improviser, was of invaluable use. Joyce and Olivia assisted. Olivia also worked on a project to photograph the boys for future posting on Open Arm's website. In the afternoons they played with the boys. It was a great experience. They can't wait to go back!
