Beyond the Columns First Presbyterian Church—Danville, Virginia 190 Years of "knowing Christ and making Him known"



As you might imagine, I am at a stage of life at which I am being encouraged to plan for the future. The knowledge that Kelsey and I were expecting, and then that Islay was born, prompted many friends we have in the financial sector to contact us about our plans for college, savings, retirement, insurance, etc. We have appreciated this, because it is good to know people who are passionate about something important, are good at it, and are willing to help you do it as well.

These days, we are necessarily more serious about planning and preparing than we had been when it was just the two of us, or before we were married. While we did some saving during those times, it was not until we had a child that the future had a clear timeline, became more concrete, and was embodied in a person. Once the child was there, the future could be envisioned.

I suppose I could have used this reflection on Christmas Eve to talk about the way that Jesus's entry into the world—into our lives—made God's plan clear and knowable, but the illustration is a good one for any time. If you have a clear idea of what the future should look like—or even what you want it to look like—then it is much easier to prepare for it. We could also think of the future like a road trip: if you know the destination, then you can figure out how to get there. If you do not know where you are going, then you either sit around stuck for a while or you spend a lot of time driving around and wasting gas until you find it.

As a church, we are now fewer than ten years away from our 200th birthday. It might sound strange to suggest that we do some long-term planning when it's "only" ten years in the future, but we should be thinking, talking, and especially praying about what God wants us to do and be as a church in ten years. While this will involve some faithful guesswork, it is fairly safe to assume that if we are going to be in a position of faithful service to Christ ten years from now, then we will not be able to stray too far from the proper path in the years between.

So, this month I will be preaching about vision and the examples that God gives us in the pages of the Bible for having healthy and faithful vision. Despite the old adage that, "if you want to make God laugh, tell Him your plans," God does want us to plan to be faithful, to make disciples, and to have a pretty good idea how to do it. He also wants us to follow "the way" that he has set for us, as expressed in John 14:6- "Jesus answered, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." In Greek, "way" is the same word as "road," so we know that Jesus is out in front of us.

That said, the way has also existed behind us and has shown us many things. As this year goes on, the Session, Diaconate, committees, and all of us will get to share in considering how God has led

us faithfully and how He is showing us Jesus's road for the future. I am excited to talk about these things and to hear your stories, both of the past and of the vision the Holy Spirit is giving you for the future.

Have a good January, and I will see you on the road!




