# Beyond the Columns First Presbyterian Church—Danville, Virginia 190 Years of "knowing Christ and making Him known" March 2017

Friends,

I hope that you enjoyed the month of February and our series based loosely on the book *You Are What You Love: The Spiritual Power of Habit*, by James K. A. Smith. If you are looking for good spring reading, then you could do worse than that. If a book on worship and habit is not up your alley, then I would be happy to suggest other books to those who want to celebrate a "reverse Lent" (i.e.-

adopting a practice instead of ceasing one). Just let me know.

This year, I will take on a new practice myself for the weeks leading up to Easter. Instead of preaching from the common seasonal passages (the "lectionary"), I will examine a series of parables that Jesus told his followers, as recounted in the Gospel of Luke. I have preached occasionally on various parables, but I have not done so intentionally in a series.

While the Bible is full of different types of literature, and while the four gospels themselves include such diverse items as speeches, stories, miracles, parables, and personal comments, the parables are often the most captivating parts of Scripture. They are sometimes mysterious, usually timeless, and they reveal much more about God and about us than their brevity would indicate. Some are brief and some are long, while Jesus explains some while finishing others coyly or with the phrase, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

In part, that means that when we hear parables, we might not be able to discern their meaning(s) unless we are truly prepared to hear what Jesus has to say to us. Even when we are prepared, however, the truths in the stories can still be pretty complex. While we often hope for stories to make it easier to understand God's will and ways, sometimes in our walks of faith we might need things to become a bit murkier and a bit more challenging.

So, sometimes Jesus might speak to us clearly in a parable (or in any other part of Scripture), and sometimes he might be telling us something that we don't quite understand. He could even use the same passages to speak to us differently at different times. It is important to remember that at the times when things seem difficult to grasp, Jesus is not pushing us away but is drawing us closer. His own disciples, who often misunderstood him, recognized this and stayed close by him, hungry to know and learn more.

Whether or not you like to commemorate Lent, and whatever you give up or take on in doing so,

remember that the Holy Spirit is always at work to draw us closer to Jesus. Sometimes that will be clear and sometimes it will be difficult to see, but our task is to follow him and join him in his work. I look forward to studying these parables with you in this month of March, and I pray that we will grasp the insights, recognize the places, and

connect with the people to whom God has sent us!





Mission Focus: Open Arms Foundation – The Perrows While you may be familiar to the Open Arms Foundation's ministry to boys, you may not know that there is also a ministry to girls. In 2008, there was an active ministry to house girls that had become pregnant as a result sex trafficking. Today, the Foundation's focus is prevention. In partnership with a church located in one of the poorest slums in Medellin, the Open Arms Foundation works with young girls to prevent future involvement in the sex trade. The young girls are involved in soccer activities in the community as a hook to draw them into the church. At church, they're taught about Jesus and about God's plan for their sexuality. They're also able to learn skills that will help them to make money in healthy and

legitimate ways. By reaching girls at an early age there is a higher

chance that they can be spared from the atrocities of Sexual Trafficking.
