A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Friends,

We are in the midst of a two-month sermon series, "Coming to Jesus," and I used this space last month to introduce it (see here). I will take a little less space this month to catch you up on some things that might have flown under your radar.

First, we have a <u>new administrative assistant!</u> Christy Edgar, our former administrative assistant, is moving

to Florida with her family. Christy did a wonderful job of updating our communications and streamlining some of our office space and processes. Plans are still up in the air, but the committee also hopes to have a special speaker come in November, so stay tuned!

As the summer winds down and we get back into the regular flow of congregational life, be sure to stop by and say hello to Vickie, to send any questions about the vision process to Session (via Joyce Perez or me), and to pray that God will show you how you can bear fruit for His sake! SQUASH CASSEROLE COURTESY OF LIB CUTTLE

From the 2009 Stewardship Supper Cookbook

2-3 cups of cooked squash

1 egg slightly beaten

1/2 stick of margarine or butter, sliced

1/2 cup of mayonnaise

1 Tablespoon sugar

1 cup grated Cheddar cheese, divided

1 to 1 1/2 cracker crumbs, divided

Dash cayenne pepper

Put well-drained, hot squash in large mixing bowl. Add egg, margarine, mayonnaise, sugar, half of cheese, and half of cracker crumbs. Season with cayenne pepper, salt, pepper, and herbs (oregano is especially good in this dish.) Put into buttered 1 1/2 quart casserole and top with cheese and crumbs. Bake at 350 F for 20 minutes. Crookneck squash or a mixture of crookneck and zucchini may be used. Serves 6-8 people. A delicate dish; freezes well.
