A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR



Friends,

First, thank you all for your prayers, cards, and well-wishes as I was in sinus surgery and recovery last month! Considering that we had four other members (that I know of) who had operations the same week, I know the solidarity that we can feel with others who have been through similar experiences and who are with us through them in prayer. Things are going well so far, and I hope that the improved breathing can make me even easier to hear on a weekly basis. Who knows—perhaps the

occasional audio issues in the sanctuary were the result of my septal spur and not a dodgy speaker system.

Second, I want to be sure that everyone is aware of this year's December schedule, as the calendar has made for some unusual scenarios. Let's work backward from the end of the month:

- -New Year's Eve is on a Sunday this year. Since it's on the other side of Christmas, it almost feels so far away that I can't even comprehend it.
- -Christmas Eve is on a Sunday this year, but we will still have two Christmas Eve worship services. One will be at our regularly-scheduled Sunday morning worship time of 11:00 AM, and the other will be our traditional Christmas Eve service with children's pageant and candles at 5:00 PM. We will also celebrate The Lord's Supper at the 11:00 AM Christmas Eve service!
- -Prior to Christmas Eve, we will have our annual Lessons and Carols service presented by our music ministries on December 17. Additionally, our monthly Community Prayer Service will be in the chapel, rather than in the sanctuary, at 7:00 PM on December 18.
- -We will ordain and install our new officers on December 10. In recent years, we have waited for the new year to do this, but with our officers' retreat on January 5-6, Session saw fit to install our newly elected officers a bit earlier than usual. December 10 is also the date of the Outlook Class's annual Christmas Breakfast, to which all are invited! It will be at 9:00 AM in the Fellowship Hall.
- -Finally, other than being a radio Sunday and the first Sunday of Advent, December 3 looks to be fairly normal. For that matter, by the time you are able to get to reading this newsletter, it might have passed! If so, please disregard this paragraph.

By this time of the year, sometimes the schedule can be so hard to keep up with that we miss our opportunities to appreciate the season. Of course, every season and every day are times that we live with the good news of God's incarnation—his taking on flesh and joining us in life as Jesus. As I continue to use various Psalms as my preaching texts for the next few weeks, I hope that they can provide some rhythm and reminders of our relationship with God and His presence with us, both in the living Lord Jesus and in his Holy Spirit. I look forward to sharing this season with you, and to all the seasons of Immanuel, God-with-us. Have a wonderful December!

1 c sifted plain cornmeal

2 c cold water

2 tps. Salt

3 Tbsp. olive oil

Mix the above ingredients in a sauce pan. Cook over direct heat on low heat stirring constantly until thick. Fold in 2 well beaten eggs and 1 c. milk. Pour in greased casserole dish. Bake 350-400 for 45 minutes.
