LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Today is the Third Sunday of Advent, and we will light the Candle of Love. Last Sunday we lit the Candle of Peace. We light it and the Candle of Hope again as we remember Jesus, born in Bethlehem, our hope (The Candles of Hope & Peace are lit) and our peace.

Today we light the Third Candle of Advent, the Candle of Love. In their old age God gave to Zechariah and Elizabeth a son called John. 
