ESTELLA'S CHICKEN SQUARES

- 1 pkg. (3 oz.) Cream cheese, softened
- 1 Tbsp. butter, softened
- 2 c. cubed cooked chicken
- 1 Tbsp. chipped onion
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1/8 tsp. pepper
- 2 Tbsp. milk
- 1 Tbsp. chopped pimientos, optional
- 1 can crescent dinner rolls or 1 can crescent dough sheet
- 1 Tbsp. butter, melted
- 3/4 c seasoned croutons, crushed

Heat oven to 350. In bowl, mix cream cheese & 1 tbsp softened butter; beat until smooth. Add chicken, onions, salt, pepper, milk & pimientos; mix well.

Separate or cut dough into 4 rectangles. If using crescent dough, firmly press perforations to seal. Spoon 1/2 c chicken mixture onto center of each rectangle. Pull 4 corners of dough to center of chicken mixture; twist firmly. Pinch edges to seal. Place on ungreased cookie sheet. Brush tops of sandwiches with 1 Tbsp. melted butter; sprinkle with crushed croutons.

Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until golden brown.

Gravy:

1/2 can cream of mushroom soup

1/3 c milk

Mix together and heat until warm, pour on top of cooked chicken squares.

Serve immediately.


