

Beyond the Columns

The Song of Solomon compares the love between a man and a woman and the desire we have for a close relationship with our God. In the entire Lectionary sequence there are 156 Old Testament passages listed as potential lessons about which to preach. Only one of them is from Song of Solomon. We preachers tend to shy away from any mention of the book in our preaching for many reasons. It never mentions God. It is almost entirely poetry with no plot whatsoever, and where some Christian writers have compared the relationship described in the poem as an allegory to Christ's relationship to the church, that is a bit of a stretch. As I read it again, however, 2:8-13 did bring to mind a spiritual lesson that could be far more instructional for our lives than writing or reading romance novels. Amidst all the imagery of leaping gazelles and peaking stags there is the call to "Arise, my love, my fair one and come away. For now, the winter is past, the rain is over and gone. The flowers appear on the earth; the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land. The fig tree puts forth its figs and the vines are in blossom; they give forth fragrance." It brought to mind memories of the first moments you laid eyes on the love of your life. Suddenly your senses reach a new heightened state where you see everything from a new perspective. Food at your favorite restaurant tastes even better because of the person that is with you. The movie you go see seems even funnier because you have someone to laugh with you. The world comes into a new focus because you see it through the beautiful eyes of your beloved. Everything you do seems more fun, lovelier, and positive. The possibilities of life seem endless.

The language of the Song of Solomon reminds me of looking into the eyes of your new born child. The beauty and love you see in their eyes help everything seem more hopeful. Your heart seems to expand exponentially as you stare into your child's partially shut eyes and think of all the fun, all the heartaches, and all the wonders of the world you will experience again while watching your child grow, learn, and explore the world on their own.

Love of another person can compel one to arise and come away from a world where "I" am the center of my own universe to a world where "We" are the center of existence. The two worlds are as different as the Spring is from the Winter. The loneliness of the winter is filled with cold harsh winds. When you are in love, the winter is exchanged for the beauty of the gentle breezes and life-giving showers of the spring. The "We" centered world is made even better when God is part of the "We".

BLACK BEAN SALAD BY LIB CUTTLE

Ingredients:

1 red, 1 green, & 1 yellow bell pepper, diced
1/2 c red onion, diced
1 can corn, drained
1 clove garlic, minced
1 tsp cilantro
1/4/c olive oil
4 Tbsp. red-wine vinegar
1 tsp. lime juice
Salt & pepper, to taste
1 can 15 oz. black beans, drained
