Another year has passed. A new year has begun, and with it, a combination of excitement at what could be and dread at what might happen. As we age it seems as if time speeds up exponentially. When we are children, Christmas seems to take a decade to come every year. When we are older, decades seem to go by in the blink of an eye.

God has a different perspective on time. Time began with "The Word." "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. At first, I didn't like the post because I like going to church. I love the beauty of the building. I like the people that attend church on a regular basis. I have always appreciated the historic traditions and sound theological doctrines of our denomination. Feeling comfortable in my faith is a feeling I appreciate. I've spent almost 32 years leading congregations in a certain way and God has been able to use me to reach out to others and help them to know of God's love and grace.

Yet, as I read the post again, I gained an appreciation for the challenge it lays before us. As much as I appreciate the past, what I most appreciate about my relationship with Jesus Christ is that it is constantly changing to meet the challenges the world sends our way. Our faith never stays the same because if it did, it would grow stale. Faith evolves over time and helps us respond to the new challenges each year brings. If you had told me 32 years ago, how serving God would involve helping to start a soup kitchen, putting insulation in a mobile home, helping to building a deck on a home and running a mimeograph machine I would never have believed you. Forty years ago if you had told me I would serve 6 congregations in any other capacity than choir member, I don't think I would have believed you.

Faith is not something that can be defined or directed solely by those things we can see or measure or conceive. Faith is something that is defined and directed by the one who was at the beginning, is with us all the days of our lives and who will carry us to eternal life. As First Presbyterian Church seeks to evolve in ways that will meet the new challenges that 2019 will bring, let us not define ourselves only by what is contained within the walls of our building. Rather, let us be defined by He who spans all time and place. He was certainly never limited in His love for all of His children and neither should we.

Matthew and Teresa Lee, missionaries in Cameroon, West Africa, visited First Presbyterian December 5 for Wednesday night supper. They showed pictures and a video to share information about the country, their friends and co-workers, and their mission. Approximately 40% of the population is Christian, but many have no Scripture in their language. Working for Wycliffe Bible Translators, Matthew coordinates the production of both New Testaments and entire Bibles in the local languages of the people. His team is ecumenical, including Lutheran and Baptist translators. He

showed several of the volumes of scripture they have produced. Teresa has been teaching kindergarten students of missionaries in the Greenwood School, a local school that serves all ages. The Lees are currently on leave in the US to raise supporting funds for their return to Cameroon. During this period, they will be located in Texas where Matthew will complete his master's degree in linguistics.

Having this exciting young couple so dedicated to the work of spreading the Gospel and sharing the word of Jesus truly enhances our spiritual growth and willingness to support their commitment.

HOLIDAY CRANBERRY CHICKEN & OREO COOKIE DESSERT

WEDNESDAY NIGHT SUPPER

Holiday Cranberry Chicken

Yield: 4–6 servings

1/2 c. Heinz chili sauce

1/2 c. whole cranberry sauce

2 Tbsp. orange marmalade

1/8 tsp. ground allspice

2 Tbsp. vegetable oil

2 Tbsp. sugar

4-6 boneless, skinless chicken breasts

Combine first 6 ingredients. Mix well. Pour over chicken. Cover tightly with foil and bake until chicken is tender and well done. Remove foil during the last few minutes of baking to slightly brown the chicken. Do not, however, allow the chicken to become dry. Spoon sauce from pan over each chicken breast and serve.

Oreo Cookie Dessert

Serves 12

20 oz. pkg. oreo cookies crushed 1 stick butter (melted) 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese 16 oz. Cool Whip

1/2 c 10x sugar

1 large pkg. instant pudding (vanilla or chocolate)

Crush oreo cookies & mix with melted butter. Use 3/4 of the mixture to line the bottom of a 9x13 pan. Mix together cream cheese, Cool Whip and sugar and spread over the cookies. Mix instant pudding according to package directions and pour onto top of cream cheese layer. Top with remaining 1/4 of the crushed cookies. Refrigerate overnight.
