Beyond the Columns

What did the disciples pray for after seeing Jesus crucified? We don't know very much about the day between Good Friday and Easter. We know it was the Sabbath. Did they go to the synagogue to pray? Did they stay away afraid of what might happen to them if they showed up? Matthew tells us that the Pharisees and the Romans were suspicious of the disciples. We know Jesus' followers were afraid. We know this because John tells us that on the evening of Easter day, but before any of them had seen their Lord, they were hiding behind locked doors for fear of the Jews. Were they praying that what they heard about Jesus was really true? Were they simply praying that God would protect them from those who sought them out?

They were in a period of transition. They were being transformed from being part of a group of believers who followed an earthly rabbi to being something different. They had no idea that they were to be Apostles sent to tell the world of God's son. In the midst of their fear what were they talking about and praying for? Times of transition are anxious times filled with uncertainty and worry. They needed guidance. They needed strength. They needed Christ's presence to reassure them and bring them the peace that passes all understanding. And, that is exactly what God brings them in the risen Lord.

The Gospel of John tells us that in the midst of their fear, and passing through the locked door of their hearts, comes Jesus bringing peace. God answered their prayers by sending the risen Lord. No better medicine can be taken. No better answer to prayer has ever been found. No surer footed guide has ever led God's people. The world outside their locked door had not changed, but His presence inside their hearts would change the world forever.

Expressing your own thoughts and feelings about the direction of the church can be a little frightening. We might think that God does not value what we have to say. We might believe that God is not listening. We might believe that our hopes and dreams are irrelevant in the face of God's will.

However, that has never been the case. God wants to hear your prayers. God wants you to put into words your hopes and dreams for this church. As Presbyterians we have always valued each voice. Especially during times of transition we seek to move in the direction God is leading us as one body. We fervently believe that no one can know God's will just by themselves. We believe we work best and come to a better understanding of God's will when we work together.

West Virginia Mission Trip!!!

This year we have an amazing opportunity to serve our Lord in West Virginia.

We will be working with Son Servants in Panther, WV. Panther is a tiny community in McDowell Co. WV. McDowell Co. has the fifth highest poverty level in the USA, and the need there is great! The work will be primarily home repair, minor construction, and painting. Our ministry partner is Panther Christian Outreach and we will be staying at a former school owned by them. Trip dates are July 22-27, the cost is \$390(financial aid is available), and this is open for Middle and High School students.

Just as an aside, I have served on staff with Son Servants in WV the past two years and the work they are doing and the relationships they have built over the many many years of working in McDowell Co. is just unbelievable. The level of poverty in McDowell Co. is almost unfathomable, driving down Hwy 52 in WV you see ghost town after ghost town; coal mining communities that are literally falling apart, this is an opportunity to get out of your comfort zone and to share the joy of our Lord with folks when you paint their house or repair their home, and that is in part, what Jesus meant when He said to "Love your neighbor as yourself." I would strongly encourage your student (and parents) to join us on this trip.

If your student (or you) are interested in join us on this trip please let me know, we do require a \$100 deposit (checks can be made out to First Presbyterian Church and please note WV Trip). 

WEDNESDAY NIGHT SUPPERS

Zuppa Toscana

2 lbs. Jimmy Dean ground sausage

2 potatoes, cut into 1/4 inch slices

3/4 c. chopped onion

6 slices bacon

1 1/2 tsp. minced garlic

2 c. kale -washed, dried, and shredded

1/3 c heavy whipping cream

1 qt. chicken stock + extra

Fry sausage and drain grease

Dash of red pepper flakes

Salt & pepper to taste

Place onion and bacon slices in large sauce pan and cook over med. Heat until they are almost clear. Remove bacon and crumble. Set aside.

Add garlic to onions and cook additional minute. Add chicken stock and potatoes, simmer 15 minutes or until potatoes are done.

Add sausage, kale, cream and crumbled bacon. Simmer 4 minutes and serve.

MESSAGE FROM VISION COMMITTEE



Vision 4 of our congregation's Vision Document says: "We see a church that is open to change where change is needed. The word of God does not change, but the world we live in does change. Some changes can be good and bring new life to our church."

Some of us seem to be wired to respond favorably to change, while others dread anything new or unfamiliar. The truth is, we are called to always be in the process of change – personally, as we are transformed into the image of our Savior Jesus Christ, and corporately: as we are reformed and always *being* reformed.

Change is an inevitable fact of life. While you may personally tend to feel averse to change, the reality, is that openness to change and new experiences is significantly correlated to happiness. What can be done to make change easier and more palatable? We can learn to grow. We can *intentionally* seek opportunities for growth, *proactively* learn something new, and *actively* seek after transformation.

Sometimes congregational growth can lead to ambiguity and perhaps even conflict. When we learn to deal with conflict in healthy ways – when managed well with lots of love – it can actually bring us closer together. We can be open to the innovations that God brings to us. And we can value more than ever before the opportunity to collaborate as we discern the will of God.

In Romans 12: 1-2, the Apostle Paul does a great job explaining the transformation that's supposed to be normative for Christians:

"So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you."


