Early in my time here at First Presbyterian – it might have been my first sermon – I made the statement that all ministers are interim ministers. We all serve in the various locations God sends us for whatever time God needs us. Whether we serve a congregation for one year or 30 years, we serve in the time between the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ into the world the first time and the coming of our Lord for the final time.

We are called to take care of God's people helping them to



know the love of God and inspire them to share that love with the community they live in. We are to witness to the life- giving, awe-inspiring, comforting presence and power of Jesus Christ in the world. We are to lift up the Word of God as the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to us. And, we are to help whatever congregation establish a new vision of how to serve God each day. We do this in God's time.

Paul was the ultimate interim minister. He travelled the world to spread the Gospel wherever God sent him. He would go to Philippi to teach and preach and then he left. He would establish a church in Thessalonica and then leave. He would travel to churches in Galatia, Ephesus, Corinth and Rome teaching and preaching as he went. He knew that each place had its own challenges. His job was to do his part in bringing people to know and love the Lord. He would then leave the nurture and care of the congregations to others. Barnabus, Timothy, Apollos and others would take the seeds planted by Paul and help them grow and spread the gospel to places Paul would never see.

Paul still loved the people he left behind and wished them well, but God had other places for him to go. It is my time to leave you in order to minister to another congregation. My hope is that our time together has been fruitful and that this church will continue to show God's love and share God's love under the able leadership of whoever comes to be your next pastor. Paul never left a place without sending them a challenge and charge. To paraphrase Paul's charge to the Thessalonians, "Now concerning love of the brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anyone write to you for you yourselves have been taught by God to love one another, and indeed you do love all the brothers and sisters throughout Danville . But we urge you, beloved, to do so more and more, to aspire to live quietly, to mind your own affairs and to work together." Then a little later in chapter 5, again paraphrasing, "I appeal to you brothers and sisters, to respect those who labor among you, and have charge of you in the Lord and admonish you; esteem them highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves. And we urge you beloved to admonish the idlers, encourage the faint hearted, help the weak, be patient with all of them. See that none of you repays evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to all. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus. . . May the God of peace himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be kept sound and blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do this." I really can't say it any better than that.

I thank you for all the love and support you have given me during my time with you. We love you all. Go and do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with your God my friends until we meet again.
