### Beyond the Columns

Dear friends,

Two weeks ago I had the pleasure of attending our Presbytery of the Peaks meeting accompanied by two elders from First Presbyterian Church. It was a super meeting with a beautiful and interesting Celtic influenced worship service. The Presbytery of the Peaks is in a transitional season not unlike First Presbyterian Church. The Presbytery has conducted a Mission Study after the retirement of our former General Presbyter and soon we will elect a nominating committee to search for the next General Presbyter. Sound familiar?

At the meeting we voted on a new Mission Statement. It was short and sweet and adopted with consensus approval. I want to share the first half of its priorities with you.

To strengthen every congregation, campus ministry, new worshipping community, community of faith, and leaders of all ages through communication, connections, and education.

- a. Emphasize frequent and effective communication, employing appropriate technologies both old and new. b. Emphasize partnerships among congregations by building relationships of love, care, mutual support, and sharing through a network of active Neighborhood groups.
- c. Emphasize education and leadership development at presbytery meetings, in Neighborhood groups, and through digital technology. d. Emphasize an awareness of the larger ministries of the PC(USA) around the nation and world.

To interpret this statement just a bit, let me simply say that it emphasizes **relationships**, **connections and partnerships**. This is a significant change from the way that presbyteries functioned a generation or two ago. We used to emphasize programs when we had much larger resources. But as we have become smaller in scale we are emphasizing the relationships and connections between people in our shared ministry for the purposes of God's kingdom.

So many of our churches are smaller in scale than they were a generation ago. Sound familiar? I am wondering how the presbytery's change of emphasis from program to people resonates with our churches and this church in particular. Does this sound like good news or bad news to you? I'd love to know what you think. My email is plaidpastor@yahoo.com.



#### 12th ANNUAL DANVILLE AREA CROP WALK

# Sunday, October 6, 2019 3:00 p.m. Ballou Park

The Danville Area CROP Walk is scheduled this year on Sunday, October 6. Since Marie Louise Crane served as the CROP Walk Recruitment Chair since its inception in Danville, the local CROP Walk Committee unanimously voted to hold this year's walk in her honor. In addition, the Danville Area CROP Walk Committee is establishing the Marie Louise Crane *Golden Shoe Award* that will be given each year to the church or organization demonstrating the greatest enthusiasm. The award will rotate each year. We definitely want First Presbyterian Church to win the award the first year!

The CROP Hunger walks have addressed issues of hunger and poverty locally and internationally for 50 years. Money raised fights hunger in areas around the United States as well as more than 80 countries such as Serbia, Guatemala, Dominican Republic, Paraguay, Argentina, Georgia, Myanmar, Kenya, Cambodia, Vietnam, and Timor-Leste. Funding helps families expand vegetable gardens, raise chickens, promote good hygiene, build renewable energy technologies, and build water purification systems. Of the money raised in Danville, 70% goes to the Church World Service to help the countries listed above meet human needs and become more self-reliant while 30% stays in Danville to support God's Storehouse. Truly our efforts are meeting the mission of our church.

We are asking you to participate in this worthy event! We have already set up a First Presbyterian Church Team! We are hoping our youth will walk at the event – and as many adults as possible. You can create your own team (sign up online) or walk as part of the First Presbyterian Church Team. There are two walk options. For the serious walker, there will be a **5K Walk from Ballou Park to Church of the Epiphany and back.** For the more moderate walker, you can participate in the **1-Mile Walk from Ballou Park to West Main Baptist Church.** We are hoping each walker can raise at least \$55. We will walk rain or shine. Let's have a huge team walking for the CROP Hunger Program AND for Marie Louise. Wouldn't it be great if we won the Marie Louise Crane *Golden Shoe Award* at the close of the race and be able to hang it at First Presbyterian Church the first year!

If you cannot walk, we are asking you to donate to a team. That way, you will help our youth raise funds. You can give cash or checks (made out to CROP Hunger Walk) to walkers or to Jackie Rochford or Barbara Wilkins You can also donate online to the team of your choice by going to *danvillecropwalk.org*, CLICK ON: *Team*, FIND & CLICK ON: *First Presbyterian or your team*, and fill out donation information. AND – come to the park, help out, and root for our First Presbyterian team(s)!

<u>September 19</u>: While you can donate after September 19, teams will be seeking donations by **9/19/19**. Teams and individuals who turn in forms and money by this date will be assured CROP Walk T-shirts. Those signing up later will be given remaining T-shirts on a first-come-first serve basis.

Jackson, Barbara, and Jackie will have more information for you as the deadline approaches. The Danville Area CROP Walk is one of the mission projects of the church. Please help us support this worthy event!



There will be a congregational meeting Sunday September 22nd to vote on our new slate of officers. Please plan on attending our worship services September 22nd.


### Stewardship in Action
