
### Beyond the Columns

### Dear Friends,



On the last Sunday of October, the 29<sup>th</sup>, many Christians around the world will observe Reformation Sunday. It is always the last Sunday of October. This year we mark the 502nd anniversary of an event that ignited the Protestant Reformation. On All Saints' Eve, October 31, 1517, Martin Luther, a learned monk, nailed a statement titled "Ninety-Five Theses upon Indulgences," to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther objected to the lavish, wealthy leaders of Rome manipulating the poor religious German people out of their money.

The Protestant movement would spread across Europe. John Calvin was studying and teaching in Paris, France when he decided to leave an academic career and pursue the ministry in Geneva, Switzerland. John Knox would study with Calvin in Geneva and take the Reforming spirit back to his homeland of Scotland. Thus the fiery beginning of Presbyterianism started to take root among Scots there and in northern Ireland and eventually would make its way to the American colonies.

We will celebrate this day and the rich heritage of Scotch Irish Presbyterianism with a Kirkin' O' The Tartans service for Sunday worship. If you have a family tartan, wear it this day. Or if you feel the Spirit move, wear your kilt!

It's a rich and wonderful history. Of all the many treasures in this chest, the one that may resonate well with folks at First Presbyterian Church is the idea of the "priesthood of the believers." I witness your officers and members take this to heart.

The Reformation desanctified the role of the religious leadership of the priesthood. In its place the reformers elevated the role of the laity in the leadership of the church and in the importance of living the faith in the world. Today Presbyterians continue to ordain elders and deacons as well as pastors. We are all called to be Christians and we all share in the responsibilities of ministry.

The Lord Jesus Christ guides all of us in the nurturance and sustenance of the church. And it takes all of us to help the church be what God is calling it to be.

**WHEN**: Every Saturday; volunteers work from 10:15 a.m. to 1 p.m. Lunch is served at 11:30 a.m.



Thank you Betzy for your dedication to the Lord's work.






### YOUTH PICTURE
