Dear friends,

I remember when I started as your interim pastor this past summer and heard some of the elders and deacons talking about the possibility of a Lay Renewal Weekend. It struck me then, that it said something very important about your church. Your leaders were not satisfied to simply wait around until you called your next installed pastor. Rather they saw very clearly that ministry is something shared by all the people of the church. It is not just a pastor's thing. It is a Christian thing. Any way that First Church can nurture this view of ministry as a shared partnership of clergy and congregation will bear much fruit and make for a stronger church.

Let me make one observation that I hope may add to the experience of the Lay Renewal Weekend. The last time that First Church had a Lay Renewal Weekend was in the late 1980's and for many people it was a vitally important experience of faith. It was a great event. Yet I think that it is important to remember that First Church was very different in many ways in the 1980's; it was much larger in numbers of people. March 13-15, 2020 will be a different experience from that one. Yet God's Spirit will still be at work doing new things. The Holy Spirit in the Scriptures is often described as wind or breath, something that is unseen to the eye but perceived by faith.

There is a great opportunity for the church on this weekend. The faith opportunities will be relational. It will be a time to connect and deepen relationships with fellow church members and with God. Let us all keep this upcoming event in our prayers.



PRESBYTERIAN MISSION EMPHASIS

Dr. Paul Sydnor serves as the European leader for the IAFR. He is a Presbyterian pastor and a cofounder of the Refugee Highway Partnership (RHP) in Europe. Paul holds an Mdiv and MA in counseling from Gordon-Conwell and a PhD from the Oxford Centre for Mission Studies. He and his wife, Reinhild, live in Lille, France.

Paul highlights his work in the past year to strengthen IARF's influence and reach into Europe as follows: (1) partnership with One Heart in Greece, a team focusing on organizing medical assistance (2) research and development for placing workers in Italy (3) teaching a course "Mission and Migration" in Germany (4) participation in the executive team of the Lausanne Global Diaspora Network and support for the annual conference; Paul has written a chapter for the Lausanne book Refugee Diaspora, one of Christianity Today's recommended books. (5) visit to the Kakuma refugee camp in Kenya to see and hear about refugee life outside of Europe (6) leadership development in the Refugee Highway Partnership.

The local relational ministry centre in Lille, France continues to be strengthened through donations and the arrival of ministry partners. As non French people ministering among refugees, Paul and partners are strangers there, too. This fall they initiated a monthly prayer group for the centre. ***Our prayers are requested for committed local volunteer who can work alongside Paul to help develop their efforts in a French way.

On a personal note the Sydnors' son Noah, was married in December. Daughter, Tessa, is teaching at the Black Forest Academy in Southern Germany. Reihild has been on medication for over a year to regulate trigeminal neuralgia. Shocks of pain come and go in cycles. She says she is learning to live with her limitations. Paul lost his mother last February.



RECIPE OF THE MONTH

"MILK & HONEY COOKING SCHOOL LEARNING THE HISTORY OF GOD'S PEOPLE THROUGH COOKING & EATING"

BY DAPHNA FLEGAL & LEEDELL STICKLER

Esau's Pottage

1 onion, chopped
1 tbsp. olive oil
1/2 tsp ground cumin
1/2 tsp ground coriander
2 cloves garlic, minced
3 c. chicken stock
1 c red lentils
1/2 lb. spinach (optional)
salt

Saute onion in olive oil with cumin and coriander. Add the garlic at the last moment and brown. Add lentils and stock. Stir well and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer 45 minutes until lentils are tender. Cook 10 minutes longer if necessary. Add spinach 15 minutes before serving. Salt to taste. Feeds 6.

Helpful hint: Red lentils are difficult to find unless you have a Middle Eastern specialty grocer in your neighborhood. They aren't very red anyway, so substituting the regular lentils will hardly be noticed.
