Some will be comfortable gathering in person in the sanctuary, and some will be more comfortable gathering online. We will record the service on Sundays beginning July 12, 2020 and they will be posted later in the day. So although you are viewing it online, it will be a "delayed" broadcast, but will be posted online that Sunday. So we will continue to minister to those who want to continue worshipping online.


If you choose to come in person to the sanctuary, the Sutherlin entrance will be the only way in and out of the building. Please read carefully the precautions that our Back to Worship Workgroup has put together so that we can protect one another. No communion will be served during the month of July. We hope to have adequate supplies for communion in August. Our preaching schedule for the remainder of the month will be July 12-Joyce Perez, July 19- Jay Hayes, and July 26-Jackson Weller.

Necessities for Gathering in the FPC Sanctuary

- •First, if you are uncomfortable in any way attending, please feel no pressure to show up in the sanctuary. We will continue to post worship on-line. We are all in this together!
- •If you are in a known high-risk category or if you have any symptoms (e.g., cough, fever, etc.) please do not attend the live service. Your safety and the safety of others is of the utmost importance.
- •The church building will be cleaned and sanitized before and after services. Though this is the case, please touch as little as possible. Here are some changes to worship:
- •Offering plates will not be passed. They will be at the front of the sanctuary for those who wish to place their tithe in the offering plate. This can be done either before worship begins or after the service.
- •The hymnals, pew Bibles, and fellowship registers have been removed from the sanctuary for now.

Bulletins will be sent out online, and can be printed at home and brought to church or viewed on your phone during worship.

You will notice many changes to our order of worship. Congregational singing is discontinued until the danger has passed. We will also try to refrain from unison speaking (like the call to worship, apostle's creed, etc.).

If you need a hearing aid device while in worship, they will still be available. You may pick one up as usual, and a basket will be provided for its return so that it may be sanitized between uses.

Physical distancing will be maintained inside the building. You are free to sit with family members or others you have shared time at home. You will notice taped off areas in the pews that serve as a guide to proper spacing. Be observant and considerate of others and follow physical distancing guidelines. ROWS HAVE BEEN TAPED OFF FOR SOCIAL DISTANCING PURPOSES. Please DO NOT break the tape to sit "where you want to sit".

Children are welcome to attend and be in the service with their parents. There will be no childcare or Sunday School provided until further notice.

The official CDC recommendation is that masks be worn. Please bring a mask with you to church. If you do not have a mask, FPC will have a limited number of masks available. These must be worn when entering and exiting the building. We will also ensure that adequate hand sanitizer is available throughout the church building.
