It will draw us out of our brokenness and into a rhythm of life that is dramatically different from what the world offers.

We were created with an insatiable thirst for relationship with God. Jesus looks to you and me today and offers us life-giving water that satiates our most foundational thirst. He places within us "a spring of water welling up to eternal life." He gives us clear, boundless access to intimacy with God that our hearts might overflow with rivers of his loving-kindness. We were made to experience true rest and satisfaction in one place and from one relationship: intimacy with the Father. In Jesus we find what our hearts have been looking for from our first breath. In Jesus we find a pathway to the Father not formed by our exploration or wandering, but by his steadfast love and unceasing pursuit.

This love – this grace - isn't something we have to strive for. It's not something we have to work to earn. Rather, it's a free gift of salvation, that we can simply open our hearts to and receive.

However, it is not a cheap grace – we are called to be workers in the kingdom. God's grace working in our lives was never meant to stop with only a personal salvation lived in isolation. Instead, in 1 Peter 4:10 we find Peter telling his readers to be faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms, using our gifts to serve one another. God's grace is reflected in our lives through his equipping of believers to serve within the body of Christ; using our spiritual gifts. Our gifts vary from person to person and potentially over time. But as both Peter and Paul affirm, God equips us for the good of the body. Our spiritual gifts are a reflection of God's grace to the overall body of Christ. God is working within us to grow the body and help it to function at its best.

And still, even this corporate exhibition of God's grace isn't the end as the grace of God calls us to extend what I would call radical hospitality – grace that overflows beyond the boundaries we normally put up between people we perceive as being different.

All of this emerges as we connect God's grace – his steadfast love – with who we are as children of God and together as the church. By the irresistible grace of the Triune God we are:

DRAWN IN to experience God's grace. (John 6:44)

DRAWN TOGETHER to embody God's grace in our relationships.

DRAWN FORTH to extend God's grace to others

This rhythm of life is God's promise and our great hope, yet it is also a fact that many things threaten to distract, discourage, and derail us from God's plan for us to live joyful lives – joy that is unspeakable and full of glory.

While we may never fully grasp the depth of God's grace, we are drawn into the conversation and into this life-giving rhythm by a God who has an irresistible claim on our lives.

Thanks be to God!

As a visible reminder to live fully into this rhythm, we will be displaying banners between the columns to help us engage with the community of Danville as we reimagine Life Beyond the Columns – both our life together on the inside of the building and our life outside the building within the community.


Day School will plan to open back up after Labor Day. We're still accepting registrations!!
