You may also be interested if descriptors like "stuck," bored," "exhausted," "anxious about the future," or "in need of better options" fit a little too well in your life right now.


Over the next several weeks we'll explore the surprising parallels between creativity and the spiritual path. In the process, we'll uncover some unexpected ways by which a narrow life may open out into more expansive territory, how a flattened life may be revived and once again become three-dimensional, and how we all may find and live into our "sweet spot"—or our sacred Calling—a bit more fully.

In the modern world, there is crucial need for creativity. When you compare the world as it was in the 1950s and the world we live in now, for instance, it quickly becomes apparent that the average person of any age or occupation has been asked—no, required—to respond to shifts that our ancestors only a few generations ago could not have envisioned. The stresses and strains have been extensive. We've had to do some pretty quick thinking—and soul-searching—as a species to come out on top of these shifts or even just to keep up with them. Sometimes they seem on the verge of overwhelming us.

History has proven over and over that when the Holy Spirit is at work in people on a vast scale, you get into some pretty "deep shift"! If you think that God is sitting idly by on the sidelines watching all the challenges we face and not doing anything to help us out, think again. Yet whatever God does involves an in-breaking of new awareness. With every awareness we're called to break out of whatever box we've been in and follow the Spirit into new territory.

In this series I will be challenging you with a single question:


Does God live within YOUR dream, or do you live within GOD's dream?

How you answer this question—not with your lips but with your life—determines the extent that you will truly be happy.

If God's role in your life is merely to live within YOUR dream, then God must live within the limits of your intelligence and imagination. You define the playing field, and God must play by your rules, stay within your boundaries and timeframe, and play on your side. When you live within God's dream, however... well, let's just say the playing field

becomes far larger than you can imagine. And the game is different.

In the creative process—as in the process of spiritual transformation—you dream God's dream, then you hover around God's dream until your response to it comes out of your deepest loves and passions. After a period of hovering, you take the risk of acting on what you've discerned.

Once you've acted, you listen. You listen because you've entered new territory and need to pay attention to the new information you receive as a result of being in a new place. Then you reintegrate your listening to further refine the vision and adjust course where necessary. Finally, you rest and celebrate what you and God have accomplished

together—which further inspires you to dream all over again.

Hopefully, you will rekindle and reimagine our life together BEYOND THE COLUMNS.

REIMAGINE LIFE BEYOND THE COLUMNS

"Love one another as I have loved you." Jesus issued this new command and promised that "By this, everyone will know that you are my disciples." This mission of the church is unchanging but each new circumstance demands new energy, imagination, intelligence, and love.

The officers and congregation of First Presbyterian Church-Danville, Va. wrote down and published a 'Vision for Spiritual Growth' statement to guide our decisions in following Jesus' command at this time and in this place. The statement contains this sentence: "Just imagine what God can do with a congregation of 200 people following His will." The Holy Spirit which produced such a sentence has empowered our search for pastoral leadership and has enlivened conversations on every aspect of our life together.



A new vision produces change. We now welcome Rev. Dr. Elizabeth E. Broschart

(Pastor Beth) as our new Minister of Word and Sacrament. You also have noticed changes in some of the church spaces, changes in the bulletin, and you now see a new banner in the front of the building which reads "REIMAGINE LIFE BEYOND THE COLUMNS". It is no accident that this banner picks up on the City theme of "Reimagine That Danville Virginia".

To be sure, we are not engaged in simple civic activity. We are introducing a courageous statement of our purpose in this place and for this time. Three additional banners will be hung to complete the message. Watch the sermon texts, listen to the sermons, reread the vision statement on the web site, and you will appreciate the message as it is revealed.

Further, you have seen and will have a chance to display in your yard or office window, a sign which is shown above.

This sign uses a modern symbol "#We Are The Church" to remind us of our identity as a part of Christ's body with many gifted parts.



We have purchased the Hygenica Electro Hygiene System which will disinfect and sanitize our church. We are using this through out the building. The chemicals used in the "fogger" will "remove 99.9% of viruses, pathogens, and bacteria, including most coronaviruses, including but not limited to COVID –19, influenza A, rhinovirus, and norovirus."* At times a slight residue is left behind that can feel "sticky."

There is a sign up sheet at the Main Street entrance next to the Admin. Office. If you are a committee chair, please fill out this sheet when you meet at the church so the room can be disinfected.


