Some of you have noticed that our closing hymn during the month of December has been denoted as a Carol of Resistance.

Each of the carols that closed our services were written at a time with there was terror in the world. These carols were written with a subversive message that pushed back against the terror of the day and expressed hope in the face of despair, love in the face of hate, joy in the face of oppression, and the work for peace instead of apathy in our communities.

These carols closely mirror the narratives of the prophet Isaiah, the first chapters of the biographies of Jesus according to the Gospel authors, the stories of music in the midst of persecution and death, and the music of our own lives.

These carols express the yearning for a new and better day.

All of them are familiar but perhaps the stories of the contexts in which they were written are not so familiar.



Singing has always been a subversive way to imbed hope in our hearts and even the courage to truly make a difference. As we begin a new year and consider the work that needs done in our world, I am making the suggestion of a film, titled "The Singing Revolution" As many reviewers say, it is a "David and Goliath story." A tiny nation that has seen decades of horrors under the thumb of the Nazis and the Soviets, finds a way, without an army or any weapons, to reclaim their independence. Their only weapon... was singing. It is a deeply moving testament to the power of collective singing and its affect on the collective will and imagination of a people. Here is a <u>Description</u> by filmmakers James Tusty

and Maureen Castle Tusty:

"Most people don't think about singing when they think about revolutions. But in Estonia song was the weapon of choice when, between 1987 and 1991, Estonians sought to free themselves from decades of Soviet occupation. During those years, hundreds of thousands gathered in fields to sing forbidden patriotic songs and to rally for independence. The Singing Revolution documents how the Estonian people regained their freedom and helped topple the Soviet Union along the way."
