

## \*Call to Worship

God, forgive our weak and vacillating faith, which is more conditioned and controlled by the pressure of the crowds than the presence of Christ. Replay the Crucifixion within our minds so that we might see your wounded, outstretched hands of love. Lift the shadows of sin and drive home the redeeming goodness of this Friday.
