Make me a channel of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me bring your love. Where there is injury, your pardon, Lord, and where there's doubt, true faith in you.

Historical Context

This prayer has been attributed to St. Francis of Assisi, the Italian friar and founder of the Franciscan monastic orders. The text is absent from his writings, however, and can only be traced back to 1912 when it was published in a French Christian magazine, *La Clochette* (The Little Bell), published by a Parisian Catholic organization, *The League of the Holy Mass*. It has been theorized that the league's founder, Father Esther Bouquerel, may have penned the text with inspiration from the life and works of St. Francis and his contemporary Giles of Assisi. This text was widely publicized, spoken, and sung throughout both World Wars.
