Your Faithfulness, O Lord, Is Sure

Your faithfulness, O Lord, is sure in all your words, your gracious deeds. You gently lift all burdened souls and well provide for all our needs.

The eyes of all are fixed on you; by you their wants are all supplied.

Your open hand is bountiful, and every soul is satisfied.

Lord, you are just in all your ways, and kind in everything you do. Forever near you stand to hear and help all those who call on you.

My mouth shall speak your praises, O Lord; my soul shall bless your holy name. Let all things living join the song of praise, from age to age the same.

ABOUT THE ANTHEM:

This tune, WINCHESTER NEW, was composed anonymously by a German musician in the late 17th century. Charles Wesley introduced it to the English-speaking world when he chose it for a music collection published in 1742. The harmony we are singing today was written by William Henry Havergal, an Anglican clergyman, composer, and writer. The Havergal name appears many times throughout most hymnals, as William's sons Frances Ridley Havergal and Henry Easter Havergal went on to become hymnwriters themselves. Frances was primarily a writer, poet, and hymnwriter. Henry Havergal was a clergyman, like his father, and then a professional organist. This paraphrase of Psalm 145 was written in 1989 by Joy Patterson, a Presbyterian elder from Wassau, Wisconsin. Ms. Patterson worked as a Social Security administrator and French professor. She still made time to write at least forty-five hymn texts and compose thirteen hymn tunes. Her lyrics are both fresh and poignant; they fit seamlessly into the contemporary lexicon of reformed hymnody. They stand up well alongside the treasured classics of church music history.
