2024 CROP Walk – October 6, 2024

It's CROP (**C**ommunities **R**esponding to **O**vercome **P**overty) Hunger Walk time again. The walk is October 6, 2024 at 3:00 p.m. In September, you will have the opportunity to donate to the CROP Walk and to join the First Presbyterian CROP Hunger Walk Team. Look for information. For those who do not know, the CROP Hunger Walk is sponsored by Church World Service. Annually, in communities throughout the United States and beyond, neighbors of all ages, faiths, and cultures walk together to take a stand against hunger in our world. Approximately 75% of the funds raised locally go to Church World Services projects designed to combat hunger in the poorest areas in the world. The other 25% stays in Danville and is given to our local food pantry, God's Storehouse.

Since the Danville Area began the CROP Walk in 2008 (with help of our own Marie Louise Crane!), the area has raised \$272,120.34 to combat hunger, including almost \$80,000 to God's Storehouse. This year, we hope to take the CROP Walk to the next level: more walkers and more funds to help combat hunger and poverty here in Danville and around the world.

Your help is needed! The 2024 walk is scheduled for Sunday, October 6, starting in Ballou Park. Walkers can walk one mile or 3 miles – or whatever distance you want. In September, information will be announced at First Presbyterian Church. You can help in the following ways:

Join the First Presbyterian Church Team – we want lots of walkers. **IMPORTANT: We want all walkers to get a CROP Walk T-Shirt. We will need to know if you are going to walk AND your T-shirt size by Sunday, September 8.** Whether you walk or not, we need your donation. You can write your check to First Presbyterian Church, indicating it is for the CROP Walk. We will collect all funds and write one check to the CROP Walk after the event.
