About the Anthem:

This arrangement by the late American composer Mark Schweizer combines the well-known Gaelic hymn tune, ST. COLUMBA, with J.S. Bach's equally famous Prelude in C Major. It is an intriguing gentle combination of an Irish tune and the German Baroque composer's first prelude for piano in his collection, The Well-Tempered Clavier. This set of lyrics for the twenty-third Psalm was written by Sir Henry Williams Baker, a Vicar and hymnwriter in the Church of England. He was educated at Trinity College, Cambridge and took Holy Orders just after his college graduation. He is known for using simple language and smooth lyrical rhythms. Baker completed John Mason Neale's English translation for, "Of the Father's Love Begotten." This paraphrase of Psalm 23 is his most popular work; it has three additional verses that are not included in this arrangement. Henry Baker's last words were the third verse of this Psalm setting,

"Perverse and foolish, oft I strayed, but yet in love he sought me, And on his shoulder gently laid, and home rejoicing, brought me."
