"The Angel Gabriel" Basque Carol | English text by Rev. Sabine Baring-Gould (1834-1924) Arranged by John Raymond Howell (1936-2013)

The Angel Gabriel from heaven came, his wings as drifted snow, his eyes as flame. "All hail," said he, "Thou lowly maiden Mary, most highly favored lady," Gloria.

"For known a blessed mother thou shalt be, all generations laud and honor thee. Thy son shall be Emmanuel, by seers foretold, most highly favored lady," Gloria.

Then gentle Mary meekly bowed her head, "To me be as it pleaseth God," she said. "My soul shall laud and magnify His holy name." Most highly favored lady, Gloria.

Of her Emmanuel, the Christ, was born in Bethlehem all on a Christmas morn, And Christian folk throughout the world will ever say: "Most highly favored lady." Gloria.

Gloria, Gloria, Gloria, Gloria.

About the Anthem:

This carol originated in the Basque language, spoken primarily in northern Spain but also a small section of modern-day southwestern France. It was translated by an Anglican priest, Reverend Sabine Baring-Gould, who spent a winter in the Basque country as a boy. He is best known as the author of "Onward, Christian Soldiers," but he penned over 1,240 other works. Rev. Baring-Gould was known as an antiquarian as well as a writer of novels, poems, and prose. He also particularly loved writing biographies of saints and notable ministers.

The arrangement we are singing today was written by Dr. John Raymond Howell, a longtime music professor at Virginia Tech. He was originally from Washington state, and he attended Indiana University for graduate school before taking a full-time assistant professorship at Virginia Tech in 1979. Dr. Howell had something in common with Rev. Baring-Gould in that both loved studying antiquity. Dr. Howell specialized in the musicology of early European music, as well as choral conducting and viola performance. He wrote this arrangement especially for piano and voices, a treatise on simplicity. I love how he illustrates the mystery of the Annunciation using ascending and descending patterns. Also, the final section of "Glorias" is fivefold in total. This setting sounds to me as Gabriel and the heavenly host singing, "Glory to God in the highest" with angels' wings moving rapidly through the night sky.
