About the Anthem:

Dr. Patrick Liebergen, originally from Green Bay, Wisconsin, was a renowned choir director, arranger, and composer, as well as a music editor and Professor of Music at the University of Wisconsin-Stout. He described his greatest accomplishment as conducting his own compositions at Carnegie Hall. He also performed his own works at St. Peter's Basilica at the Vatican and at St. Paul's Cathedral in London. One of his compositions was also chosen for the Mormon Tabernacle Choir's annual Christmas special. As I read about Dr. Liebergen's life, I was struck by his appreciation for nature and his truly deep enjoyment of life. His sons remembered their father's love for canoeing, boating, and photography. He spent as much time in nature as possible, and this undoubtedly influenced his hundreds of musical works.

As we contemplate the peace of Christ on this second Sunday of Advent, perhaps we can each make time for a few moments in nature. It can be difficult to spend time outdoors during the cold days of December. Even looking out of a window or smelling a Christmas tree can remind us of our connection with God's creation. A wonderful devotional resource I use to feel God's peace on earth is Tim Janis's YouTube channel with nature videos set to carols and hymns. May the peace of Christ go with us as we enter another week of preparation for the coming of Christ.
