About the Anthem: Natalie Allyn Sleeth was an American organist and composer of

over 180 pieces. She earned the BA in music theory from Wellesley College in Massachusetts (1952). Originally from Illinois, Mrs. Sleeth spent much of her adult life in West Virginia, Nebraska, and Texas. Her husband, Reverend Dr. Ronald E. Sleeth, was a professor of Homiletics and later a college president. Natalie is best known for composing "Hymn of Promise," also known by its first line, "In the Bulb, There Is a Flower." She dedicated her most wellknown composition to her husband, Ron, who passed away shortly after its premiere in 1985. "Hymn of Promise" became immensely popular in the United Church of Christ, the United Church of Canada, and the United Methodist Church when it was published in these denominations' hymnals. Its popularity spread to many American churches, and it was translated into German for inclusion in the Evangelical Methodist Church Songbook in 1999. While far less popular, today's anthem is equally beautiful and full of God's promises. This song is a prayer or blessing sung to the congregation and fellow singers. We are reminded that God's care for us never ends, His Spirit is with us everywhere, and His love surrounds each of us. As Christians, we have comfort and peace remembering that God is always with us, everywhere. God has promised, "I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee." (Hebrews 13:5b); "...and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen." (Matthew 28:20). Nothing can ever separate us from the love of God (Romans 8:38-39).
