BENEDICTION

About the Anthem:

The spiritual "We Shall Overcome" is closely associated with the 20th century Civil Rights Movement. Like most spirituals, its original writer and composer are unknown. The version of the song we sing today most likely descended from Reverend Charles Tindley's 1901 gospel song "I'll Overcome Some Day." Reverend Tindley, a Methodist minister, took inspiration for his song from Galatians 6:9, "And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not."

The arrangement of "We Shall Overcome" in our hymnal was written by William Farley Smith, a United Methodist minister originally from Durham, North Carolina. Smith earned his bachelor's and master's degrees at the Manhattan School of Music (1963, 1964). He went on to earn master's and doctoral degrees in education from Columbia University (1982, 1984). He taught in New York and New Jersey public schools for over twenty years, as well as at Montclair State College. Dr. Smith was appointed to Drew University as a dual Professor of Music and Professor of Worship in 1990. He also served as minister of music at St. Mark's United Methodist Church in Harlem during the 1990s. His arrangements were published in many hymnals,

including Songs of Zion (1981), the United Methodist Hymnal (1989), and the Celebrating Grace Hymnal. In addition to this arrangement of "We Shall Overcome," Dr. Smith is best known for his harmonization of the gospel song, "Soon and Very Soon" and his arrangement of "I'm Gonna Sing When the Spirit Says Sing."
