About the Anthem:

Hal H. Hopson was born in Mound, Texas into a family of thirteen children in which playing music was the primary pastime. His first piano teacher was his older sister, Merle, whom he credits for much of the musical and personal influence on his life. His popular hymn tune, MERLE'S TUNE, was named in her honor. Hal first played for worship services at age thirteen; he went on to graduate from Baylor University (B.A.) and Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (M.S.M.). Mr. Hopson has been a working church musician throughout his life, as well as a conductorclinician at many choral workshops and festivals. He served as Professor of Church Music at both Westminster Choir College and Scarritt Graduate School. Mr. Hopson served on the Symposium for Church Composers sponsored by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Milwaukee as well as the Task Force on Psalmody sponsored by the PCUSA, which resulted in the official Psalter for our denomination.

Hopson is one of the most prolific composers of church music during the twentieth and twenty-first centuries. He has published over 3,000 pieces of music with more than thirty publishers. Hal writes for every sacred genre: children, youth and adult choirs, organ, piano, harpsichord, handbells, hymn tunes, responsorial Psalm settings, and liturgical services. One of Hopson's cantatas, God with Us, was chosen by the Kennedy Center to be placed into a time capsule during the American bicentennial celebration in 1976. It will be opened and performed at the country's tercentennial in 2076. Many of Hopson's hymn tunes, arrangements, and settings can be found in our hymnal, Glory to God, as well as our choral and handbell libraries. His compositions are accessible to nearly all musicians, and yet they are beautiful, fresh, and interesting.
