About the Anthem:

Nolan E. Williams, Jr. is an American composer, musicologist, producer, and music director. His parents, grandparents, and greatgrandparents were all Baptist ministers. Nolan grew up spending a lot of time in church, and on a particular Sunday his father's church choir sang "Lean on Me." After the service, four-year-old Nolan went up and asked the pianist to play the song again for him. When he got home, he sounded out the notes and played through the song himself. His great aunt, Daisy Marie Young, started teaching him piano after this incredible display of talent. Nolan grew up to attend Oberlin College (1990, BA in Music, piano performance) and Howard University (1993, M.Div.). Reverend Williams' commentary on the book of Habakkuk was published in Many Voices: Multicultural Responses to the Minor Prophets (1995). He also served as an editor for the African American Heritage Hymnal (2001). Williams' music has been lauded as a 'language all its own,' while the African American Heritage Hymnal has been called the "most important contribution to Protestant hymnody within a century" (Dr. Wyatt Tee Walker). Williams' music was sent into space on the test flight of the Orion spacecraft in 2014 alongside Maya Angelou's poetry manuscripts. He has directed music at the Major League Baseball All Star Game, the White House's annual National Christmas Tree Lighting, the Kennedy Center, the Lincoln Theatre, and Philadelphia's Monumental Baptist Church. This arrangement of "I Want Jesus to Walk with Me" was completed in 2000 for inclusion in the African American Heritage Hymnal. This spiritual is included in our hymnal's section on "lament and longing for healing," and it is often sung during the Lenten season to aurally illustrate the Christian's daily walk with the Lord.
