

Random Thoughts from Jackson

April begins with April Fool's Day, 1 Corinthians 4:10 says, "We are fools for Christ, but you are wise in Christ!" (These may not be the same type of fools). Paul is using the word fool to really emphasize that the Church's commitment to Christ and that Christ's message is seen as foolish by the world. Paul is writing to the church in Corinth which has become divided and prideful, valuing worldly wisdom and status over the message of Christ. Paul is really urging them to reconsider their priorities and focus on true wisdom that comes from Christ, even if it means being seen as foolish by the world. In Proverbs 3:5-6 it says, "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to Him and He will make you paths straight." God's calling us to throw out what we understand or recognize as the way to go about doing things (worldly wisdom) and to embrace the way that God would have us to do things (Godly wisdom); to trust God and not our own gut or our own understanding of the way things should be. It's trusting God when what He calls us to do doesn't make any sense at all. It's that stepping out of a boat onto water when we know perfectly well that we can't or at least shouldn't be able to walk on water, it's that rolling the stone away from Lazarus' tomb when you know he's been dead for 4 days, continued on next page

it's that dipping in the Jordan River seven times when you know there are cleaner rivers in your homeland, it's that going up to the mountain top to offer your son as a sacrifice when you know that he is the son God promised you, it's that staying in the prison cell when the gates have flung open and the chains have fallen off of you, it's that thing that doesn't make a lick of sense to you or the world around you, but you do it because you know that is what God would have you to do. We throw out what makes sense and we trust God because we know in our heart, we know fully, that God is faithful always and trustworthy always. As we approach the cross this month, let's throw out worldly wisdom and be fools for Christ's sake, trusting Him and knowing that He will carry us through everything (it's not as easy as it sounds, but trust God even when it doesn't make sense and seems foolish).



WHEREAS on January 17, 2023, Mary Ina Russell Ingram passed from the Church Militant into the Church Triumphant, there to dwell eternally in faithful worship of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost, and

WHEREAS for almost sixty years Ina served faithfully as a member and leader in First Presbyterian Church, Danville, and

WHEREAS her loyal service included Deacon, Elder, Sunday School Teacher, Chairman of the Christian Education Committee, member of the Administrative Committee, and President of Presbyterian Women (formerly Women of the Church), who recognized her achievements with the award of an Honorary Life membership in Presbyterian Women of PCUSA, and

WHEREAS Ina's embrace of the Great Commission included active participation in Mission Trips to Turkey, Mexico, Belize, Chattanooga (twice), and Washington, D.C. (twice), and

WHEREAS her Christian leadership led to her appointment as a member of the Committee on Ministry in the Presbytery of the Peaks, and

WHEREAS Ina was a devoted wife and loving mother to husband James Franklin Ingram, daughter Ina Carol Ingram McGee, and sons James F. Ingram, Jr., and Robert Russell Ingram, and

WHEREAS Ina's extensive civic involvement included president of the Wednesday Club and active membership in organizations as diverse as the Gabriella Garden Club, Shakespeare Club, and Colonial Dames, and

WHEREAS her devotion to education included service as a public school teacher and one of the first Executive Directors of the Danville Community College Foundation, which raises money for scholarships for needy and deserving students, and

WHEREAS Ina was a gracious hostess after the fashion of Mary and Martha in the New Testament, which was owing to her natural love of people, her skill in conversation, her keen sense of humor, and her familial models (Ina was the granddaughter of First Lady of Georgia Mary Ina Russell; a favorite niece of U. S. Senator Richard Russell, whom President Lyndon Johnson referred to affectionately as "Uncle Dick;" a favorite sister-in-law of Georgia Governor Ernest Vandiver; daughter of Fifth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals Judge Robert Lee Russell; and wife of Virginia Circuit Court Judge James F. Ingram), and

WHEREAS Ina's deep sense of humility would have caused her to blush as she read the accolades mentioned above.
