#### About this Hymn:

Clara Harriet Fiske was born in Elk Grove, Illinois, the daughter of farmers. When Clara was fifteen, her family moved to Chicago. Two years later she enrolled at the Chicago Musical Institute in 1858. During her studies, Clara met and married Henry Clay Scott. She soon became a successful composer, hymnwriter, and music publisher. Clara Scott was the first woman to publish a collection of choral anthems, the Royal Anthem Book, in 1882. The year before her death, she published a hymnal, Truth in Song. Clara published at least forty-nine hymn tunes and eighteen hymn texts. "Open My Eyes, That I May See" is her most popular composition, by far. It has been published in at least 192 hymnals and translated into several languages including Spanish, Malayalam, German, and Portuguese. Clara was inspired to write this hymn after reading Psalm 119. The opening phrase takes inspiration from the eighteenth verse, "Open my eyes, so that I may behold wondrous things out of your law." (Psalm 119:18, NRSVue) I have fond memories of singing this hymn with my aunt Lynne's choir at Antioch United Methodist Church in Cumberland, Virginia where she played the piano for twentyseven years. She returned to our home church, Guinea Presbyterian, eleven years ago.

Open my eyes, that I may see glimpses of truth thou hast for me. Place in my hands the wonderful key that shall unclasp and set me free. *Refrain*: Silently now I wait for thee, ready, my God, thy will to see. Open my eyes; illumine me, Spirit divine!

Open my ears, that I may hear voices of truth thou sendest clear. And while the wave notes fall on my ear, everything false will

disappear. (*Refrain repeats*) Open my mouth, and let me bear gladly the warm truth everywhere. Open my heart, and let me prepare love with thy children thus to share. (*Refrain repeats*)
