About the Anthem:

This traditional West Indian Christmas carol was notated in 1942 from the singing of a man named James Bryce when he was age 92. It is traditionally sung in both English and Spanish ("La Virgen Maria tuvo un bebe"). Today's anthem was arranged by the famous Presbyterian composer, Hal Hopson. Mr. Hopson published over three thousand works for choir, organ, piano, harpsichord, and handbells. His music is heard weekly in congregations throughout the country. He worked to compose music that was "accessible to nearly all choirs and congregations, always striving to include, rather than exclude" (ECS Publishing Group). Hal Hopson's cantata, "God with Us," was selected by a panel at the Kennedy Space Center to be placed in a capsule during the US Bicentennial in 1976. It will be opened at the Tricentennial in 2076 and heard again as a representative piece of American choral music of the twentieth century.

Thirteen of Hal Hopson's compositions can be found in the *Glory to God* hymnal, at numbers 109, 290, 378, 402, 434, 447, 608, 609, 639, 693, 736, 782, and 798. Our Chancel and Handbell Choirs have sung and played many of his compositions and arrangements, located in our music libraries. Hal had a special gift for composing music that people love to sing (and play). His children have created a service musician fund in their parents' honor to support the Service Musician faculty position at Montreat and to promote excellent congregational singing at the annual Worship and Music Conference. I have to say I deeply enjoy singing and playing Hal's works – they are pure joy printed in notes and rests. It is an honor to continue his tradition of spirited choral and congregational song.
